Brevard Achievement Center Summer Career Camp:

June 10 – July 26, 2019 Rockledge: It's Summertime again and that only means one thing! Brevard Achievement Center is back with its paid, intensive summer camp experience. Students will learn the basics of work expectations, practice interviews, create resumes and learn the how to not only get a job but keep a job plus much more. The summer camp will have various educational field trips to learn about the post-secondary opportunities available to them. The program runs three weeks, from 8:00 AM to 12:00 PM each weekday. (40 or 60-hour sessions)

Computer Coding and Web-Development:

June 10 – July 29, 2019 Melbourne Area. An eight-week collaboration between Brevard Achievement Center and Code Craft Works, another local non-profit where students will learn the basics of coding programs such as HTML5, CSS and JavaScript. The in-class portion of the program runs from 8:00 am until 12:00 pm. This will be followed by a practical work experience from 1:00 pm to 3:00 pm with a field related local business partner. Students will also complete a Pre-Placement Training class (20 hours) on 5 consecutive Friday's. During the program, students will create a website/e-portfolio to display their progress. The on the Job Training component will give students a paid work experience reinforcing what is learned in class. The last week will consist of a demo day where students will be able to present their work to local businesses, family and the media.

Summer Employment Education:

June 10– July 26, 2019 – Rockledge/Melbourne/Titusville: Brevard Achievement Center will continue to offer Pre-Placement Training (PPT) and Self-Advocacy (SA) twenty-hour programs regularly throughout the summer. These vital classes help prepare our students to enter the work place and advocate for their needs in a professional manner. Programs will run over the course of a week but may also be available on the Saturday mornings if interest allows.

City Specific Work Programs:

June 10 – August 2, 2019 – West Melbourne/ Palm Bay: a special collaboration between City Hall and Brevard Achievement Center with a focus on raising awareness on the types of jobs available at each municipality. Types of work available will vary by site; some sites will offer experiences with water works, the police department and office work. Others will offer Parks and Recreation positions; please inquire for the specific job availability in your area.

Specialized Training Programs:

June 05 – July 27, 2019 Brevard Zoo: This is the third year that Brevard Zoo and Brevard Achievement Center have collaborated to present an exclusive program that gives students a unique opportunity to work in a zoo. Students have a choice of three departments including Education, which provides a chance to practice public speaking, help with summer camp and raise awareness of the Brevard Zoo's mission. The Front Desk will include customer service and shadowing office staff with completing ticket sales transactions. The third area is working in the Aviary, helping customers with purchasing bird food to feed the birds and learning to do cash transactions.

June 7 – July 26, 2019, Viera Area-United States Specialty Sports Association (USSSA): (Must be at least 18) A summer partnership between USSSA and Brevard Achievement Center that teaches lawn care, facilities cleaning and maintenance of a sports complex. Students will be outside working under the guidance of a supervisor in a fun environment learning the basics of field and facilities care.

June 06 - August 09, 2019, Brevard Board of Education Print Shop: Students will get a first-hand experience working in a print shop, operating various types of trade equipment.

June 06 – June 28, 2019, Brevard Board of Education Transportation: Students will work alongside transportation workers in cleaning and preparing the buses for the new school year.

June 06 - August 09, 2019, BRICK program: a specialized program developed by the Home Builders & Contractors Association of Brevard (HBCA), Brevard Public Schools and Brevard Achievement Center focusing on hands-on, career orientated construction program. The program has over twenty plus local businesses willing to train and prepare students for a career in the construction field.
